Welcome Back to Parkland!

While the summer has been nothing short of amazing I am sure, it brings our team joy knowing our students will be returning next week. We look forward to the excitement that accompanies the first day of school.

We will be opening our doors to students once again in our staggered start format, with our **Grade 9's and 12's starting on Tuesday, September 2nd**, and our **Grade 10's and 11's\* joining on Wednesday, September 3rd**. This format allows for our newest Pacers (Grade 9's) to get their footing in their new school, while ensuring our Grade 12's have the opportunity to get their timetables situated for their graduating year! \*Please note that any Grade 11 students enrolled in a 30-level course are strongly encouraged to attend those classes on September 2nd. Our doors will be open at 8:00am these days to allow additional time for students to get their timetables and find their classes. Starting on Thursday, doors will be opening at 8:15am and will continue forward as such. It was fantastic to see so many students and their families attend our Student Tours yesterday, meeting their teachers, finding lockers, and catching up with one another!

Just a note for arriving to Parkland next week, as there is ongoing construction on the YCE Multiplex, 48th Street from south of 12th Avenue to the end of the Construction Zone is temporarily closed until the end of the Phase 2 of construction. Bussing routes have been adjusted accordingly, but it will impact those driving to Parkland. A friendly reminder that school zones are in effect from 7:30am - 9:00pm daily.

The first week of school is always a busy one, and students can expect to review our PCHS Student Handbook, go through course outlines, and attend start-of-year assemblies, culminating with a **FREE BBQ Lunch for ALL Pacers on Friday**! Students in Grades 10-12 looking at making timetable changes, will be called down by grade level and last name as advisors are available. We ask that students *do not* go to the advisors until such time and attend their scheduled classes in the interim. New students with no schedule are asked to go to the office on their first day. Teachers are aware that there may be some changes in their classes the first week, and will ensure that students are caught up to speed if they join a class after the first day.

Here at Parkland, we are very excited about some upcoming events taking place at the school, and look forward to sharing them with you all. Two upcoming events are: **Meet the Teacher Night on Thursday, September 11th from 5-7pm**, and our first **School Council Meeting on Tuesday, September 16th starting at 7pm**!


